The class meets Wednesday and Friday mornings from 10:00AM to 11:30AM. The goal is to help them feel more comfortable in expressing themselves in English. The majority of the attendees are intermediate to advanced English language learners, with two that still struggle to understand and speak English. The class focuses on speaking with one another on various subjects that the instructor

finds in the news, or students discuss the origins as Christopher Columbus Day and Halloween. They also engage in dialogue about various cultural events and traditions from their countries. Activities include reading short stories; telling jokes; and describing what they see in pictures, which all require them to use what vocabulary they have mastered. They write down words with which they are not familiar from the stories they read, and surprisingly, what they most enjoy are the jokes! They have a remarkable understanding for the American cultural refer-

Meet Mackenzie

Could you tell us a little about yourself?

Hi, I am Mackenzie; I am the new case manager for the North End Service Center team! I'm a recent graduate from UMass Boston where I studied Human Services and Women Gender Studies. I come from a very small suburban town on



the south shore of Massachusetts. I was raised in a female-dominated Scottish household that cherishes hard workers and anyone who cooks well.

What if your professional background?

Before ABCD, I interned and volunteered for several Quincy-based food pantries. It was there that I learned of my strong interests in substance abuse prevention, food insecurity prevention, and social advocacy. Through these advocacy programs, I assisted my community by providing food items to those facing temporary or long-standing food insecurity, general emotional support, and referred clients in recovery to local support groups.

What are your interests?

I would define myself as a strong homebody; I enjoy solitary activities such as knitting, reading comic books, and sewing. In my free time I return home to the south shore and visit with my aunt and uncle in attempts to escape the hubbub of the city.

Tell us about your family.

My family dynamic is convoluted and interesting; there is not a lack of dull days in my family. My birth father is from the south side of Chicago and my birth mother was born and raised south of Boston. Both of my birth parents have since remarried, leading to a large amount of step and half siblings in my family tree.

Describe a typical day at ABCD's NE/WE NSC.

Lemon Chicken Scaloppini



Boneless, skinless chicken thighs are pounded thin and cooked in a fragrant lemon tarragon sauce in this elegant recipe.

Ingredients

6 boneless, skinless chicken thighs

- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 1/2 tsp. dried tarragon leaves
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. pepper

- 2 tsp. grated lemon rind
- 1 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1/3 cup dry white wine
- 1/3 cup chicken broth
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 1/3 cup heavy cream
- 1/3 cup capers, rinsed
- 2 tsp. chopped fresh tarragon leaves

Steps to Make It

Place chicken thighs between two pieces of waxed paper; pound with meat mallet or rolling pin until thighs are 1/4-inch thick. Combine flour, dried tarragon, salt, pepper, and lemon rind in shallow bowl and mix; coat chicken in this mixture.

Heat butter and oil in large heavy skillet over medium heat. Cook chicken thighs for 2 to 3 minutes on each side until browned, removing chicken from pan as it browns. Turn heat to high and add wine and chicken broth, stirring to loosen brown bits from bottom of pan.

Return chicken to pan and bring to a simmer; simmer for 5 to 10 minutes until chicken is thoroughly cooked. Add lemon juice, cream, and fresh tarragon; cook and stir for 2-3 minutes until hot. Sprinkle with capers and serve over couscous or hot cooked rice.
